These tools assist with carrying the Gospel message to the jungle communities of Guyana. However, these are just tools. We need willing gospel workers that are willing to serve the people of Region 1 and the hundreds of Venezuelan Warao refugees in the surrounding communities.



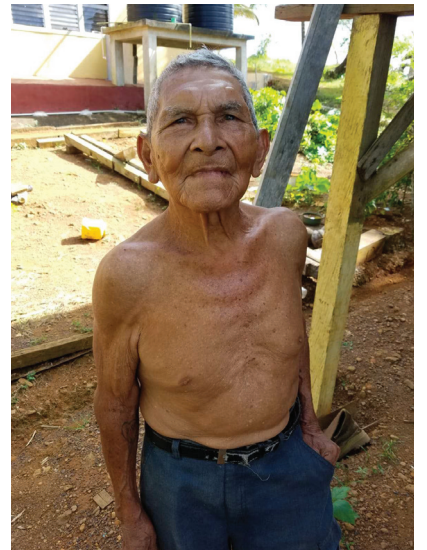
Dwelling Place and Worship Center in One

The AWA Project in Guyana has a 2-story structure right by the airstrip. The top floor supports a modest 3-bedroom, 1 bath dwelling and the first floor is structured as a worship and learning center with an outdoor washroom recently built for the congregation. God has again provided the means to build this structure as a way to reach His people in this part of the world.
