



La Tronquera Mission Adventures, Part 2

While visiting each community during our month-long stay in Nicaragua, we always asked people, “What can AWA do for you?”

Kamp Tea is a Miskito community far off the beaten path. It is often overlooked. AWA heard about a need for flour, so our AWA team prayed for the necessary funds to help this small village. Thousands of miles away in Wilson, North Carolina, the Seventh-day Adventist church heard of the need for funds to buy flour for the Miskito people. The pastor took up the call for an offering to provide the flour and the congregation responded in love.

Trusting that the money would be donated soon, we drove to a grocery store in Waspan, and purchased 65 bags of flour, each weighing 25 pounds. With a very loaded truck, Ray, Enrique, and Ervin, our trusted local employee, set off to distribute the flour to families in this poor community.

It’s astonishing to see how one’s personal donation, given during the church offering, spent at the local grocery store, personally delivered to the community by missionaries and volunteers, becomes a blessing for all of us. The smiles and thankful handshakes from the people are what being a Christian and a missionary is all about. The small gesture of this gift of flour, to make perhaps the only loaf of bread that week, is proof that the Lord is always listening and answering our prayers.

While at the mission base, there was a request for propane and nails. Transportation is mainly by motorbike or a crowded bus. Most walk the three hours to the mission base to purchase these supplies from our workshop. Helping in any way possible, we also offer free welding repairs on bikes and motorbikes when needed.

Thanks to your ongoing donations to the Nicaragua Project, we can continue to serve all who come seeking help. As we put the Holy Spirit first in our lives and ask for humble hearts, we are able to reach out in visitation, witnessing, and friendship.

We know the blessing of missionary life. There is a real need for a missionary family or two; a pilot, a doctor or nurse, that can also assist not only with La Tronquera, but with each one of the communities we visited while in Nicaragua.
