The Venezuelan refugees *desperately* need continued support and assistance, as do the Guyanese people who are experiencing less work due to the implemented isolation/stay at home mandates.

With travel restrictions in effect worldwide, our AWA mechanics, inspection team and missionaries are unable to travel to Guyana to conduct the required inspections and to continue the flight and groundbased mission work. However, our local trusted partners are standing in the gap to ensure the safety and security of our planes, Lifestyle Learning Center and hangar. Brother Stoll together with his wife Sister Janeth, who live next door (30' away) keep a daily watchful eye on all the AWA assets. Brother Stoll also tends to the grounds and Worship Center to ensure all are kept clean.

Brother Norman, who leads Sabbath worship services, and who lives in the same community as our AWA mission base, checks on the safety and security of the mission base and assets. Brother Norman and his large extended family have become quite good at reporting suspicious activities. Finally, Alfi from
