The good news last week here was that the Cessna 172 XP repaired/overhauled engine is now back on the airplane. This airplane experienced a rather catastrophic alternator drive failure while on a training flight last August. Although the oil pump drive was sheared the engine did not seize, and the pilot landed at the Palmer, Alaska airport safely. Praise God for that!

Fortunately, there is an engine overhaul shop right there, which in due time was able to tear-down, repair, and overhaul the engine. That work was completed in early April, but due to the intrastate travel mandates, the reinstallation of the engine had to wait until the restrictions were lifted.

Upon request, the engine shop allowed me to do the honors of engine installation and completing an annual inspection at the same time in their shop. This represents a several thousand dollar savings over having to pay them to do the work. They even assigned a mechanic's helper to help me at no charge. There are about 8 mechanics/technicians who are employed in the shop and most of them at some point asked what the AWA logo on the tail stood for. This gave me the opportunity to discuss many things about our mission and aspects of a spiritual nature.
