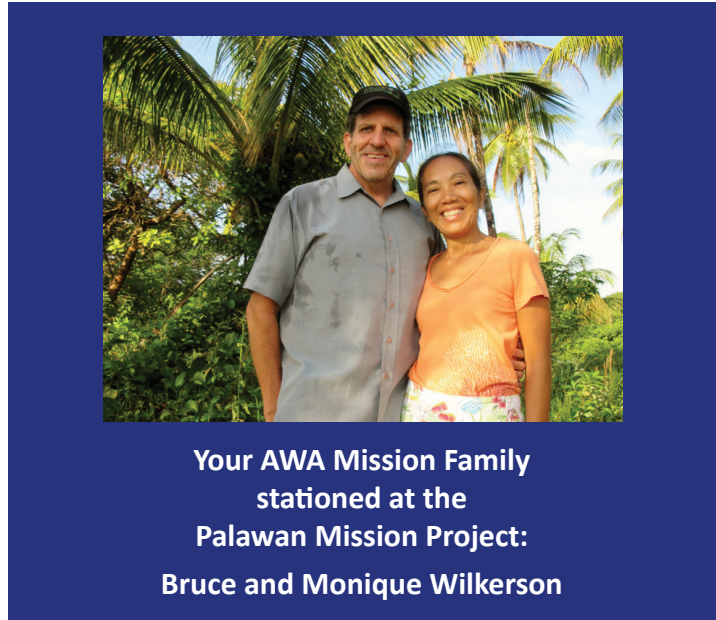
Scripture for the Month
