
## Aviation Maintenance Project Update The Stevenson Family

Things are bustling here at HQ in the Smithfield hangar. It's great to be busy for the Lord and watch how He works with us and through us according to His good will. The hangar is packed to the brim with five aircraft, all of which need some sort of attention - from annuals to avionics to reskinning, Kyle is hard at work!

We've had wonderful volunteer help that has come to be a part of the AWA team; even some that are consistent now to help with the abundant work. With a growing need fitting God's people for the mission field, whether in our home country or in a foreign land, our partnerships with individuals, organizations, churches, etc. continue to grow. Lewisburg, Tennessee is the location for one of our newest relationships: Christ Adams Flight Academy (CAFA). They have N9579E - the plane for the Uganda project - in service at their flight school while the Uganda project is under development. People are learning to fly at CAFA with the thoughts of potential mission work ahead. Our Cessna 172 N46518 is up there as an instrument ship so that students can acquire their instrument rating.







Recently, one of AWA's aircraft that had been in storage just south of Wisconsin's border, was trailered back to HQ. We're all eager to see it returned to good standing. At the moment it is in need of some TLC. It's called a Cheetah, which is a light sport aircraft that's great for training; lightweight, durable and is "skinned" with fabric instead of metal. Half of the skin needs to be put back on the frame—wings, tail and elevator. One of our volunteers, Wiley "Sonny" Gardener, an AWA supporter from Wilson, NC, has been helping put the skin back on. While the Cheetah slowly takes shape, we look to the future. Ideally, AWA would like to see it in action with the Chris Adams Flight Academy. CAFA would like to see it in action at their airfield too. Everyone is eager to have it back together and in running order once again. How can an airplane that needs to be reskinned, put back together and potentially placed at a flight school be service in God's vineyard for soul winning? Well we ask: how is it not?
