About a week and a half into our stay in Florida, I received a text from my boss to get ready to go on a trip to respond to another storm. Hurricane Beta was inbound and there was an ice storm that tore up Oklahoma City. The next day we got on the road and drove through Hurricane Beta at night. A few days later after chasing storm damage reports, we ended up in Atlanta, GA. Beta wasn't a hurricane when it passed through there, but it was still generating winds up to 70 mph! We took up to 3 trees a day off houses; some being quite large. We didn't talk to the home owner every time, so we didn't get to hear everyone's experiences. One in particular that I heard was interesting to me.

We showed up on a job where there was a pine tree that had sliced through the second floor of a home. The wife said her husband was sleeping

in the bedroom where the tree fell. He had just rolled over for whatever reason and the tree came crashing on the bed where he was just laying. I think that an angel must have disturbed him and maybe even pushed him over.

Sometimes in our lives we go through times where we don't see God working in an obvious way. We might be cruising along accomplishing goals and experiencing no real hardships; but when we run upon a storm in life, be it a literal one or figurative, that is when we see God's hand most readily. When our need is the greatest, then He shows Himself the strongest. Sometimes we, like ancient Israel, put ourselves in a hard spot by our own decisions, and we reap the fruits of our own bad choices. At other times it maybe an attack from the devil that has plagued us. No matter the reason, if we humbly surrender to God and pray for deliverance, He will answer in the best possible way. Sometimes though God protects us from dangers we haven't even thought about. Like a tree falling across your bed while you're sleeping. God is just that awesome!

better. The boys hardly have any symptoms, but Yosi and I had some severe headaches and chills we treated as standard flu symptoms.

We lean on Jesus and we thank you for your prayers and support.
