I have quit work there twice, but God has opened the doors for me to work there three times now; which enables me to care for my family's needs.

You know... there's been tight times this year for us financially speaking, but God has always provided for us. We cannot complain. In the midst



of the turmoil that surrounds us, we have a God who provides for us. We are learning to trust God in the middle of the storm.

Also pray that the doors open up for us to be able to satisfy the Nicaraguan entry requirements. Lord
