

Nicaragua Mission Outreach - Global Appeal



Greetings from AWA!

Recently, a team headed to Nicaragua for a predeployment assessment trip. Ray Young, global operations manager, and Julie Young, Canada administrative assistant, accompanied the Fix family to the AWA mission base in La Tronquera, Nicaragua. Josh and Yosiday Fix were excited to be in the country where they are going to serve as full time missionaries. In preparation for mission service, Josh acquired his private pilot's license first, then his instrument rating and then passed the commercial checkride. He also achieved his A&P mechanic's license. He is ready to be a mission pilot! Yosiday has been raising





their two young boys, Issac and Caleb. She speaks Spanish fluently, which is a plus to be able to communicate with the people in Nicaragua.

Prayerfully, the team set off to reinstate the mission work in the remote northeast corner of Nicaragua. There was much to be done; things needed cleaning and repair, and paperwork needed to be filed in order to regain permission for medevac flights. The weeks passed quickly and the work was accomplished with the Lord's guidance every step of the way.

"While there, the team was able to provide several medical evacuations in the AWA mission truck. A call came in late one night from the community nurse. She said there was a critical case involving a middle aged woman who needed immediate medical attention. There was no way to know if the one ambulance from the hospital was even available.







We went as quickly as possible to the patient's home. She was so weak that she appeared unconscious. She had been vomiting all day and was extremely dehydrated. We got her into the truck and transported her to the hospital, 40 minutes away. The woman received the urgent medical care she needed and we rejoiced that she recovered in a matter of days. Our prayer is to continue the medevacs and to use aircraft to further our impact exponentially." (*Josh Fix*)

The team has returned to the United States with the final planning underway for the Fix family's long term deployment in Nicaragua. It will be home for this young family for several years. What will the Lord accomplish through their efforts? The opportunity to save lives and share the love of Jesus is the goal.
