I had to configure the seats a bit to accommodate the passenger and while doing that I happened to see a tiny screw out of the corner of my eye. That little miracle made my day. The rest of the trip went by pretty smoothly. The passenger was very thankful for the help getting back to her home territory and to a place where her care could be continued.
