As we were preparing to go to Nicaragua, we learned that, because my mother was born in Nicaragua, I can claim citizenship there. We called the embassy in Miami, and they gave us the instructions on how to apply. Recently my confirmation arrived in the mail. I am officially accepted as a citizen of Nicaragua with the last step being that I present myself in person. I have also been given a new legal name, Caleb Runne Cabezas. My mother's maiden name is Cabezas, so the Latin American custom is that children have both their father's and mother's last names.

My aunt Lizette shared an interesting fact with us about our Nicaraguan family, and we did some research. It turns out that a not too distant relative of mine named Rigoberto Cabezas is a famous historical figure in Nicaragua. In the late 1800's Rigoberto Cabezas, a journalist, and Nicaragua's Inspector General at the time, unified the Caribbean Miskito lands with the rest of

Nicaragua's territory. He is considered a hero by Nicaragua, but not so much by the Miskito people, as they are not fond of the way they have been treated by the government. The largest city in Eastern Nicaragua where we will be ministering is called Puerto Cabezas, named in



honor of Rigoberto. We will be flying into that city often to bring patients to the hospital there.

Being a citizen of Nicaragua will open many doors for our ministry as we won't have to apply for visas, we can own property, and we can use the banks. We see how God is directing our steps. In Revelation 2:17, Jesus



says, “To him who overcomes I will give some of the hidden manna to eat. And I will give him a white stone, and on the stone a new name written which no one knows except him who receives it.” Also, in Revelation 3:12, Jesus says, “And I will write on him My new name.” We believe Jesus’ return is imminent.

Are you preparing your heart so that you can receive the new name Jesus wants to give you? I pray that you are and thank you for helping us share the Gospel with the Miskito people through your continued prayers and financial support.
