is her favorite, a Cessna 150 that she wants to use for her cross-country solo hours and her test flight. She is now flying out of the Tri-Cities Airport, gaining experience with radio communication and sharing the airspace with the commercial airlines. Her personal goal is to be finished with her license by the end of January, God willing.
