#### Pathfinder Uniforms Needed, by Edgar

Every week the Pathfinders have been hard at work with training. They are ready to be invested, but they cannot just yet because they do not have their uniforms. At every meeting we have encouraged them to save a little money every week, but they have been unable to even save enough for their monthly Pathfinder dues. These children come from very poor homes where even buying rice can be a hardship.

When it was time for AWA's monthly mission base maintenance work to be done, I decided to offer these young Pathfinders work, pulling weeds and fertilizing the fruit trees. They would be working to pay for their uniforms, and they were excited to do so.

They all decided on a day that they could all work together, which was a school day. Because of the Covid pandemic, there is still no face-toface learning. The students come to school once a week and collect packs that include lessons and tests. Then the following week they hand in their completed work and pick up a new module.

On the designated day, the young Pathfinders worked on their modules in the morning most likely without breakfast. After all their schoolwork was done, they headed out to our home. They were all very hungry, so we provided them food. Just as we were finishing up our food, it started to pour rain, making it impossible to work. By 3 pm we were able to go out and work. They worked very hard fertilizing the trees until after 6 pm, when it began to get dark. They returned to our place, exhausted and hungry. We fed them again and closed the day with evening worship. One of the young Pathfinders was so exhausted that she could not even walk home so we gave them all a ride home. A week later they returned to work again but the two days of work is not enough to pay for their uniforms. However, we know God has it already taken care of!
