When planning these arctic projects, one must not leave any essential item out of the list. Nails, screws, tools of every description, and necessities for feeding and housing the volunteers who will complete the project are all critical features of the plan.

The costs of building in a remote arctic environment are astronomical. The cost of transportation of the building package can equal the cost of the material.
