to trust instead of my usual reaction to stress out. Sure enough, God provided. The attendant found another flight that would still allow us to get to Miami on time to make our international flight to Managua, Nicaragua, and there were exactly 4 seats left on the packed airplane!

One week prior, we realized that Jordana and Enoch only had one month before their passports expired. Nicaragua requires at least 6 months to enter the country. Again, God provided and grew our faith. The one exception to the rule was if we belonged to a humanitarian agency. BINGO! But that isn't the miracle. When we arrived in Managua, the lady in immigration who interviewed us accepted our letter from AWA and allowed us entrance, but Nicaragua has been expelling non-profits from the U.S.A. for the past year. We could have just as easily been rejected for the very reason they allowed us entrance. Praise God!





You may remember that my mom was born in Nicaragua and that gives me the privilege of claiming citizenship there. I will spare you the details, but what we were told would be a simple process was nowhere near the case. We had to visit and re-visit multiple government offices in multiple cities and wait for multiple hours in multiple lines over multiple days. We are so thankful for my aunt "Tia Linda" and her husband "Tio Eddy" who graciously chauffeured us around and helped us throughout the labyrinth of a process. It would have been nearly impossible without them. God is so good, and He provides for our needs, often through the help of His servants!

Now that my process is complete for citizenship, we know the steps for the children. We still very much need your prayers that Glenda can get residency. The process as described to us at immigration is daunting, seemingly designed to be impossible. Here we are, though, in Nicaragua. We look forward to, in the months to come, sharing our adventures and God's miraculous answers to the problems we face. Blessings to you all, our beloved brothers and sisters supporting in this mission.
