One by one, all those who stopped attending the center and are no longer part of the community, as well as their families, were invited to join the following Saturday (May 6, 2023) for a family time where we would enjoy a delicious community breakfast prepared by the members, especially for the friends who would be returning home. We

cannot say that we minimized the action of the Holy Spirit, but we can easily say that we were extremely surprised with the results achieved.

We had between those we already knew, us, and those they brought, no less than 50 people joining us for a delicious and healthy community breakfast. Several plans were drawn up as a follow-up so that we continue to reach those who are part of the community, including special training for those who will have their doors open to Small Groups. We have identified among the members at least four households that are geographically located on the edges of our community. This means that not only are they being reached by the church Saturday after Saturday but also because those mini-Churches, at members' homes, are willing to save souls.

The work in Mabaruma, specifically, Hobo, is great. There is a long way ahead of us, but little by little, the results of efforts and prayers of joint work between AWA/W4H and local members are already being seen. Adventist World Aviation / Wings for Humanity seeks the lost, rescues the lost, restores the lost, and gives the lost hope for the future through prayer, and hard work, all combined with the power of the Holy Spirit, and you.
