In our service, while we spend time with the locals, we are cultivating precious friendships that enable us to understand their needs. As a result, we have been able to provide the support they need and the friendships that we have continued to grow in positive ways.

It is challenging, though, as we serve. Because of the El Niño phenomenon, we can feel on our skin the intense heat brought on by the prolonged drought. In recent weeks, the region has continued to endure the unfortunate drought to the point where some people are entirely without water, even to cook. We were able to share a good amount of water with some families. They were, in addition to serving those who come to us daily, asking for cold water to drink. Then we noticed that our water tank was almost empty. We are cultivating precious friendships that enable us to We were beginning to get worried about a possible lack of water, and we started rationing it, anticipating that we would run out within a few days. However, we trusted that God would provide some way to get water. Then, precisely on the day we were supposed to run out of water, God sent rain that filled all our water tanks to the point of overflowing, and we managed to fill four more large barrels of water. It was a moment of great joy and gratitude as we saw how God cares for us and meets our needs.

We've also found other ways to help them with their were, in addition to serving those who come to us daily, difficulties. By making ourselves available to assist them when they need medical help and taking them by car to the local hospital, our efforts have helped further grow our relationship with the community. Since we are becoming more and more better known among the residents, we have repeatedly transported the elderly, pregnant women, and infants to the hospital to receive necessary care.

We also realized that very few people can read well. Together, we decided to start conducting tutoring classes for children to help them develop their reading and writing skills and, at the same time, cultivate precious values in their hearts through the Biblical stories and songs we teach them.

We recently started a Bible class for adults. Some of the individuals interested in studying the Bible committed to come and then invited someone else to the next studies. The project to surround the hangar and install a gate has already begun. The first stage, which is to surround the hangar, is almost finished. Preparations are now underway for the next stage, which is the construction of the hangar gate.

We are grateful for this opportunity to serve God and others in this mission. We know there is still a lot of work to be done, but we are sure that God is with us at every step. We thank everyone who supports us and prays for us because, without this support, we would not be able to carry out this project.
