The annual (maintenance check-up for planes) will take a couple days, and Kyle is mindful of

that. For every moment 708 isn't flying on a requested mission, it's a moment where a life potentially isn't able to be saved and nurtured. We are the only flight operations of medivac flights in Palawan right now, so we are kept busy.

In Guyana, between the two aircraft, they need new cylinders, a new elevator, prop installation, a starter, and more. There are new missionaries that have stepped up to the plate there in Mabaruma from Brazil. However, as our project manager and developer for both Guyana and Brazil is working on his pilot's license, and, too, the husband of the new

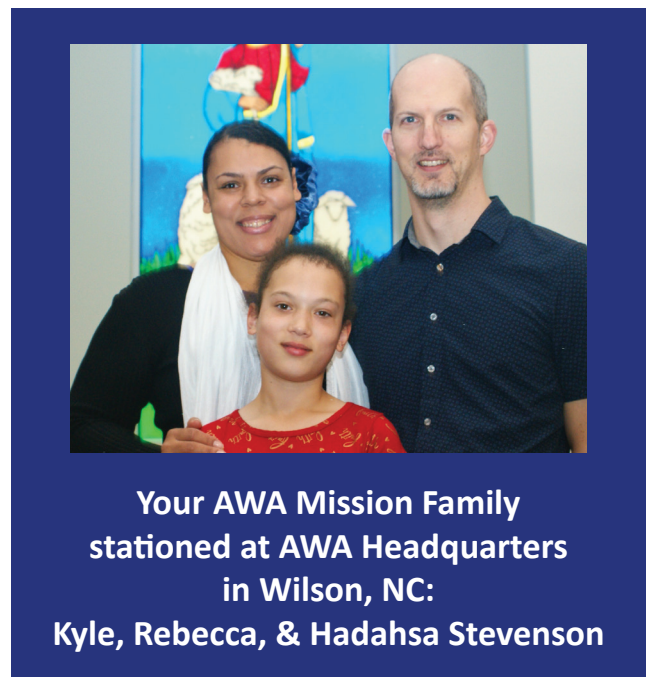
