We have experienced baptisms, lives saved, and doors opened. Our aircraft fleet is growing and some of our restorations are getting closer to being finished. We have some new and amazing staff and missionaries, pilots, and mechanics. AWA will continue to grow these relationships and help to best

prepare those who desire to put Jesus first in their lives.

There is new leadership in AWA with myself as President and Julie, as my Administrative Assistant, taking the lead positions. We will guide the ship faithfully into the future and start training the next generation to take over.

We are thankful for all of our amazing team; from prayer warriors to volunteers, donors who keep the wheels rolling, and our office workers who give far more than they receive. We are all storing our treasures in heaven.

We are thankful this time of year that God has blessed us with so much work. Although we have accomplished a lot there is still so much more to do.

We need to build a hangar in the Philippines and fence our property to keep large animals off the runway for obvious safety reasons.

In Guyana, we have new missionary candidates in training, and with the guidance of Pastor Deyvid, we are seeing spiritual growth like never before. The planes are down for now due to vandalism and we are fixing that by putting doors on the hangar and securing God's assets. Once that project is complete, we can begin restoring the aircraft back to a safe condition for flight. Our pilot training fund will need serious support as we bring in and train future pilots.

We are thankful for our missionaries in Nicaragua and all the wonderful work they are doing to spread the gospel and help the sick and suffering. Even if the plane isn't flying we use what we have to spread the love of Jesus. An airplane sometimes makes it faster and easier but it comes at a great cost. At the end of the day, we will use whatever we can to serve the Lord.

AWA just opened a small office in Uganda and will be rolling out a lifestyle ministry that we hope to grow to the point it will need an airplane to get farther than ground transportation can safely take us.

Canada had a successful summer program but is lacking pilots and management now that I'm running the Head office in the US with Julie. We are keeping both locations alive with the aid of a few helpers and Julie's dedication. The aircraft needs some avionics upgrades to bring it up to a higher standard and allow the pilots to access more capabilities and be as safe as possible.

Jim in Alaska is doing what he can and we are thankful for his continued good health. We could use more help there with people and finances. He will need support as he upgrades and maintains the planes there.

So again, thank you, thank you, from the bottom of our hearts. With our arms, we wish to send all of you the biggest hug we can possibly muster up. May God bless you and your family beyond what you could ever ask for.


PHILIPPINES - BETCHIE

Philippine flight operations have resumed this year serving patients in need of emergency transport to hospitals not just here in the islands of Palawan but also to Iloilo, Cebu, Mapun, Zamboaga, and to the mainland in Cavite.

Land transportation has also been upgraded with new vehicles replacing 2 decades old, battered, and dilapidated vehicles; making errands from the base to the city (vice versa), faster, safer, and more efficient. I also got to replace my 8-year- old office laptop which is used for my accounting and secretarial work.

ANGELWINGS

If not for the funding and the support of you, our donors, we would not be able to fly people like Hope who, without our help, wouldn't have been able to see her grandfather within his last 24 hours on his deathbed. The Angelwings flight we provided her gave her that precious opportunity to say goodbye and have closure.



We wouldn't have been able to help Jesse who, after battling alcoholism for years, finally was able to recover and fly back to his home with our help where he had a stable job waiting. How good it feels to accomplish overcoming such a big hurdle. We helped him celebrate and carried him home on Angelwings to a new life.

Butch couldn't get home to North Carolina from Georgia to be cared for by his daughter as his health wasn't good enough for such a long car ride. His wife and faithful caregiver had passed away, and he needed to go live with his daughter who could care for him. But she lived a generous day's drive away. It was too far for him to travel. However, with an Angelwings flight, we were able to pick Butch up with his daughter who came to accompany him for the flight. We flew him home where, later on, both he and his daughter did Bible studies with us and were baptized. That is a direct result of your generous support and funding for these flights.

Additionally, there are those like Michelle who was terribly ill with stage four cancer. Being without the strength or means to travel the long distance for the medical care she required, she reached out to AWA and found the remedy to her needs. She asked us to fly her to Duke University to meet with a specialist and receive the care she was longing for. Praise be to God, the new treatment she received was a success and she is still able to share a wonderful life with her family.

Melanie, a great woman of faith, was a privilege for us to fly because after she had been treated for years under an incorrect cancer diagnosis, she was finally given a correct cancer diagnosis and then properly treated through Johns Hopkins Hospital in D.C. Several times we flew her for her treatments. During some of her last rounds of important medical care treatments, it was thought that she wouldn't make it through her surgery. She needed to have a tumor removed that grew around her abdomen and was intertwined in her spine. Even if she did survive the procedure, she wouldn't be able to walk. But prayers are powerful. She not only lives, but she walks and is now cancer-free!

Still, there are more stories of the people we've flown, but as you can see, lives have been impacted, some, even for eternity. These life-saving and



hope-giving flights are our honor and privilege to provide to those in need in their darkest and most trying hours in life. Thank you for being the fuel to give our patients hope and for being an answer to our prayers and theirs. We couldn't do this without you!

Notes from Headquarters



We want to thank you for your financial support in 2023 to each project, to the critical medevac flights, to the missionaries, and to Christian ground outreach. We could not have done it all without your generosity. Each

heartfelt donation we receive from you, allows one more ill or critically injured adult or child to be saved.

As we come to an end of this giving season, we want to highlight what was attained on the projects that we managed and you supported.

In Northern Ontario:

- Delivery by air of food donations, lifestyle supplies
- Flying groups, associated with ADRA, into a secluded indigenous community, so fire detectors could be installed into homes

In the Philippines:

- 40 plus successful medevac flights for all in need
- Hiring of a pilot and flight nurse
- Hiring of two mechanics and additional ground support staff
- · Purchase of a new truck

In Guyana:

- Answered prayer for a missionary family who is dedicated to music, education and church community
- A supportive pastor who is attaining his pilot's license

In Nicaragua:

- The current construction of a small new home, with a future upgrade construction of the older base home to make it into a residence for future missionaries and a health clinic
- The need for a vehicle for future missionaries, fuel and maintenance costs are ongoing and constant repairs are needed because of the rough roads
- Funding for supplies for weekly bible studies, Spanish language classes
- · Christian ground outreach

But the year is not done yet. Our storehouse needs to be replenished to continue on with future needs in 2024.

This is Cathy with Adventist World Aviation/ Wings 4 Humanity. This is to thank all donors for your donations and support that allows us to send out missionaries to teach the word of God. We need to spread the news to so many unreachable people of Jesus's soon return. Many are being baptized. however, they still have a

need for Bibles because they can't afford them. Without your donations and support, we just couldn't operate.

We have missionaries in the Philippines, Uganda, Nicaragua, Alaska, Guyana, Canada, and a desire with Brazil. We have numerous projects where your donations are very useful. In the US, there are non-medical emergency flights called Angelwings Flights, and our newest is Disaster Response. There's Aircraft maintenance just to keep the planes flying with fuel and other mechanical parts.

The Angelwings Flights are for people who need to be transported for non-medical emergencies, cancer patients, and those who are critically ill to bring the hope of getting the medical attention they desperately need but don't have the funds for travel. We have reunited people with their family members when the patients are well enough to return home. We do these flights free of charge because so many just don't have the funds it takes to perform these tasks.

Our goal is to reach the unreachable in remote locations or on islands whether it's for medical or spiritual purposes.

We have so many areas where you can direct your donation to a certain project or even a certain missionary family, aircraft maintenance, medical supplies, Angelwings Flights, or Disaster Response. If you're undecided, you may direct the donations to "where needed most." We are trying to reach our end-of-the-year goal of \$500,000.

Even if you can't donate a large amount, small amounts add up quickly.

Thank you so much for your previous generosity in your donations to help make this possible for us to reach the unreachable in remote areas and rescue the perishing. Thank you so much for your support. God bless you.

We look forward to this next year, seeing what new things your support will help us all accomplish.


