Initially, the child only said, "Can you take my mum to town in your truck?" to which we immediately said we couldn't at this time. Upon further reflection, we realized their cooking gas bottle was empty. That means walking a long distance, so we said yes a few minutes later, we'll do that for you. The expression of gratitude for not having to walk several miles carrying that empty and eventually full gas bottle is unexplainable. This was a little gesture that relieved some suffering from a single mother of seven kids! That's just one of the many stories we have to tell about what can be done thanks to your prayers and donations. Is there a lot more we can do? Definitely, and we look forward to reporting back to you shortly.
