Everybody knows each other, and everyone we have met has been very friendly and willing to help us or give us advice. We're getting to know the community, and we can see some specific needs of the people. We've been talking to the church members and seeing the best way to help the community's needs. Our new church family is very welcoming and wants to see their church grow more, so we are excited to keep working with them.

Josh has been doing a few flights to this small village close by, named Togiak. A mission group is working there for two weeks, and they're doing a VBS, some evangelism in the village, and some renovations to the church. Josh was able to fly food, cement for the baptistery, and a few other things for them. The flight to Togiak is beautiful! The big mountains and valleys with the snake-like rivers make the scenery very impressive, which pictures don't justify. But as I was flying and enjoying the view, I could see how difficult it would be to reach these communities without the plane.

The weather is very cloudy around here. We were supposed to do a flight today, but because the plane was not set up for flight in the clouds and Josh needed to get current with his instrument flying, he could not make the flight. However, once Josh gets current and the airplane is more up-to-date, it will be much easier and safer for him to fly even when the weather isn't perfect. Of course, always respecting the limits. We need him at our home as well.

Our new home needed a lot of work—a lot of cleaning and lots of fixing. It brings me joy to see our house getting more and more homey by the day. We still need a few things, like a new mattress for my sister and winter clothing, especially for my mom and my sister, since they don't have anything for this climate. I hope they will be here with us by the end of September.

Our car and trailer came about a week and a half ago, so I'm still working on putting away stuff and trying to organize the best I can with what we have. It took about three weeks to get them, so we were very excited when they came. It felt better than Christmas! Our boys were also thrilled when we got our car and trailer because their bikes and Legos were in there. They love biking to the grocery or hardware store with Daddy to get things we need.

The boys are getting to meet new friends around here, especially at the park here in town. It's a few steps away from our house, and we get to see a lot of kids and talk with the mommies and daddies. They have a new friend named JoJo. He's a very lovely boy, the same age as Caleb. We hope to be a good witness to him, his family, and many more kids around here.

One thing I am learning for sure as we live here is to be more patient and to trust Him more. As you know, things are costly up here, and packages take forever. So anything we order cheaper online to help our budget takes some time to arrive. We really have to plan accordingly.


