



A CALL TO COMPASSION: SUPPORTING THE MISSION IN MABARUMA, GUYANA

Deep in the lush, remote region of Mabaruma, Guyana, a community of faithful Seventh-day Adventist brothers and sisters continues to live out the gospel with courage, perseverance, and unwavering trust in God. Their days are marked not by comfort, but by sacrifice—not by abundance, but by a faith that shines brightest in difficulty.

For many families in Mabaruma, daily life is a struggle. Roads are rough, food is scarce, and basic necessities like clothing, transportation, and medical access are often out of reach. Yet every Sabbath, they gather with joy. Their songs rise above hardship. Their smiles testify to a hope that refuses to die.

At the center of this mission field is Pastor Leo, a servant of God who has dedicated his life to reaching these precious souls. He travels to distant villages, prays

with families in need, brings clothing to children, and delivers food to those who often have nothing left on their tables. His work is not a job—it is a calling.

But today, that calling is suffering.

A Mission in Danger: The Failing Truck

For years, the only truck available in Mabaruma has been the lifeline of the ministry—carrying food, clothing, and hope to remote communities scattered across long muddy roads and deep forest paths.

Yet this old truck has begun to fail.

It breaks down frequently. Repairs are costly and temporary. Entire regions go weeks without a pastoral

visit simply because the truck cannot survive the journey. Families wait. Children wait. The work of compassion slows down—not for lack of love, but for lack of transportation.

Pastor Leo wants to visit more homes, bring more clothes, food, prayers, and presence. But the mission has reached a breaking point...

A reliable truck is no longer a convenience—
It is a necessity for ministry.

A Realistic Need: 29,000 USD

After careful evaluation, the cost of a truck suitable for the harsh terrain of Mabaruma is approximately: \$29,000

This is not a luxury.

It is a tool of service, compassion, and evangelism.

A new truck would allow Pastor Leo to:

- Visit distant villages regularly
- Deliver food hampers
- Bring clothing to families in extreme need
- Assist in medical emergencies
- Support church growth
- Reach souls who rarely receive ministry presence
