



LIGHT IN THE NORTHERN FRONTIER: PASTOR LEO'S HUMANITARIAN MISSION IN MABARUMA, GUYANA

In the remote rainforest region of Mabaruma, near Guyana's northern border, life often moves slowly and with difficulty. Many families face limited access to basic necessities, and transportation across rough terrain or along long river channels is a daily challenge. Yet in this quiet corner of the country, hope consistently arrives in the form of one man's dedication: Pastor Leo, a missionary of the Seventh-day Adventist Church whose humanitarian work has touched countless lives.

For years, Pastor Leo has led simple but powerful projects that bring relief and dignity to the people of Mabaruma. Through food distribution, he reaches vulnerable families who struggle with rising prices and irregular supply boats. Every package delivered—often filled with rice, beans, flour, and essential items—represents more than

just nourishment; it is a reminder that the community is not forgotten.

His clothing drives have also become a lifeline for many. Children receive school clothes, mothers find new garments to replace worn-out ones, and elders benefit from warm items during rainy seasons. What might seem small to others becomes a treasure in a region where access to goods is limited and costly.

Pastor Leo's mission extends beyond physical assistance. He offers spiritual support, encouragement, and a listening ear to families facing emotional and personal hardships. Many in Mabaruma describe him as a shepherd who not only preaches but also walks with his people through their struggles, visiting homes, praying with families, and building genuine bonds of trust.

One of the most significant challenges, however, has been transportation. The church's truck, which is crucial for transporting food, clothing, and humanitarian supplies, has been plagued by persistent mechanical issues. Breakdowns on muddy roads and prolonged delays have often threatened to halt the work. Yet even with these barriers, Pastor Leo continues his mission—sometimes traveling by borrowed vehicles or by foot—to ensure that help reaches those who need it most.

Mabaruma is a place where small acts of kindness travel far. Through commitment, sacrifice, and faith, Pastor Leo has become a shining light on the northern frontier of Guyana. His work serves as a poignant reminder that true humanitarian service is not defined by grand gestures, but by consistent compassion and a willingness to serve, even when resources are scarce.
