In a region where access and resources can be limited, knowing that a box of food may bring relief to a family’s table is more than enough reason to act.

But the moment that touched me most deeply this month happened when we came together as a group to help a friend in the community who had recently lost her mother. Grief has a way of letting things pile up, not just in the heart, but literally around the house. We showed up with hands ready to work and cleared



her yard, doing what needed to be done without much ceremony. It was a simple gesture. But in the simplicity of that afternoon, we reflected something of Jesus, the One who met people exactly where they were, in their most ordinary and most vulnerable moments.

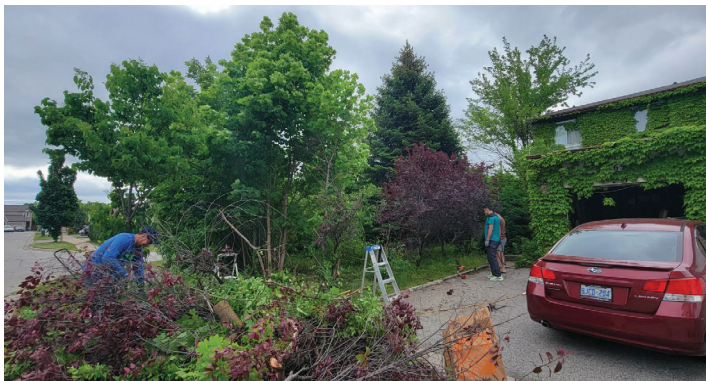
This is the mission. Not only in the air or in the communities we visit by plane, but here, on the ground, in the everyday acts of love that remind people they are seen, valued, and not alone.
