Deep in the lush, remote region of Mabaruma, Guyana, our church family continues to grow in faith, service, and unity. As we reflect on April, May, and June, we give God all the glory for what He has done and what He is about to do.

Progress: From Then To Now

When the year began, we prayed for strength to reach more souls despite rough roads and limited resources. God has answered.

Daily life here is still a challenge — transportation, food, and medical care are not always easy to access. But our faith is stronger. Every Sabbath, we gather with joy, and our congregation is growing. More visitors are coming, more members are getting involved, and more

hearts are opening to Jesus. The progress is clear: we are not just maintaining, we are growing.

Sabbath School: A Place of Growth

Sabbath School has been a bright spot these past 3 months.

- April: New quarter, new energy. Bible discussions deepened, and we welcomed families from nearby settlements.

- May: Memory verse programs started for adults and children. We also continued outreach, sharing food and clothing after class.

- June: Our largest Sabbath School attendance so far. We rearranged classes to make room for new visitors. We also started a Pathfinder group.

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God's Word is taking root in homes across Mabaruma.

Church Services: Growing Together in Worship

From April to June, our divine services have been filled with praise and purpose. Attendance has grown each month. More members are participating in music, prayer, and testimony. The presence of God is evident, and visitors who came once are now returning. Even with transportation challenges, we remain committed to visiting villages and sharing the everlasting gospel.

Property & Ministry Equipment Update

By God's grace and with the help of donors, we were able to repair one weed-eating machine and one power-washing machine. This will make cleaning the church grounds and facilities much less difficult and help us keep God's house in order.

We also had the outboard engine checked. An injector strip is still needed to complete the repairs. Once this is done, I will be able to visit the river communities to share the gospel and minister to families along the river.

Looking Ahead: New Programs Starting Soon

God is opening new doors for ministry:

1. Wednesday Night Prayer & Bible Study

Starting this month, we will begin Wednesday night services. This will be a time for mid-week Bible study, prayer, and spiritual growth.

2. Vacation Bible School - VBS

August 3rd to 7th, 2026

Children and youth will have 5 days of Bible stories, songs, crafts, and fun. We are praying this will reach many families in Mabaruma.

3. Crusade & Baptism

August 9th to 15th, 2026

We will hold a Crusade with nightly meetings. The Crusade will culminate with a Baptism for new members who have decided to give their lives to Christ. Please pray for souls to be reached.

As we prepare for VBS, the Crusade, and ongoing outreach, we will incur expenses for snacks, transportation, crafts, materials, and other ministry needs, totaling \$1,200.

I kindly ask donors and friends of the ministry to help offset these expenses. Any contribution, big or small, will help us reach more children and souls for Christ in Mabaruma.
